About Colossal Resources Corp.

Blue Diamond Mining Corp. engages in the acquisition and exploration of mineral resource properties for Diamond Ore and Precious Metal Deposits. The Company's primary research and exploration focus has been in Canada within the Buffalo Head Craton in Alberta, Northern Saskatchewan, and Northern Ontario.

Subsidiaries

The Company's subsidiaries include a wholly owned subsidiary, Arctic Star Resources, Inc.; its 55% owned subsidiary, 964919 Alberta, Ltd. and its wholly-owned subsidiary, 6183484 Canada, Inc. Arctic Star engages in the exploration of Alberta Oil and Gas properties, and through its subsidiary, has acquired 10% oil and gas interests in 81.75 sections of land in the Prairie River of Alberta. One well, 15 of 16, has been tied is producing. Three more wells have been drilled and cased.

Mineral Properties

Legend Project, Alberta

The Legend Project consists of two properties: the Little Legend Property and the

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Legend Property, which together encompass approximately 360,000 acres in the Birch Mountains of north central to north eastern Alberta.

Little Legend Property

The Company's Little Legend Property was acquired by way of Option Agreement between the Company and Grizzly Gold and encompasses approximately 23,000 acres located within the central portions of the Company's Legend Property.

Legend Property

The Legend Property encompasses approximately 337,000 within the Birch Mountains of north central to north-eastern Alberta and encircles the Little Legend Property. The Company acquired an undivided 60% interest in the Legend Property pursuant to an option agreement with Arctic Star Diamond Corporation. The Company also has the right to acquire a further undivided 10% interest in the property from Arctic Star Diamond Corporation, which holds a 40% interest in the property.

In February, 2005 Grizzly Diamonds, Ltd., has signed an option agreement with the Company to acquire an undivided 60-per-cent mineral interest in the Legend property and an undivided 51-per-cent mineral interest in the Little Legend property, both located in the Birch Mountains of northeast Alberta and comprising approximately 360,000 acres (145,000 hectares). The Company owns an undivided 85-per-cent mineral interest in the Little Legend property and the remaining undivided 15-per-cent carried interest is owned by Grizzly Gold, Inc. The exploration plan for 2005-2006 shall consist of ground geophysics and drilling.

Twin Falls property, Ontario

In March, 2005, the Company entered into an agreement to acquire a 50-per-cent interest in the Twin Falls property, located in the Thunder Bay mining district, approximately 280 northeast of Thunder Bay, Ont., consisting of six claims, namely claim No. TB 3011469, TB 3011470 TB 10501, TB 10502, TB 10504 and TB 10505. Upon the completion of the transfer, Canadian Prospector and the Company would form a joint venture on an equal 50/50 basis.

The Twin Falls property consists of approximately 2,560 acres and is located within the northern felsic volcanic belt subbelt of the Beardmore-Geraldton area. The Company anticipates an exploration program to begin. A first phase exploration program would



consist of an airborne survey, prospecting, trenching and detailed mapping. The second phase would consist of drilling targets identified by the ground programs.

Ethan Property

This property encompasses approximately 89,000 hectares in the Buffalo Head Hills, located about 200 kilometres north of the town of Athabasca, Alberta.

Three Bears Property

The Three Bears Property consists of five metallic and industrial mineral permits covering approximately 43,520 hectares contiguous to the Company's Ethan Property. There is no immediate work scheduled on the Three Bears Property.

Pelican Mountain Block

The Company holds a scaled Industrial Minerals Royalty (the IMR) based ore produced from a heavy mineral sands deposit located about 90 km north of the town of Athabasca in north central Alberta (the Pelican Mountain Property). The Pelican Mountain Property is owned by Coremetric Development Corp.

SWOT Analysis

SWOT, which stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats, is an analytical framework that identifies the internal and external factors that are favorable and unfavorable for a company.

Enhanced SWOT Analysis

Enhanced SWOT is a 3×3 grid that arranges strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats into one scheme:

How to use the strengths to take advantage of the opportunities?

How to use the strengths to reduce likelihood and impact of the threats?

How to overcome the weaknesses that obstruct taking advantage of the opportunities?

How to overcome the weaknesses that can make the threats a reality?

Upon answering these questions a company can develop a project plan to improve its business performance.

PESTEL Analysis

PESTEL (also termed as PESTLE) is an ideal tool to strategically analyze what influence different outside factors – political, economic, sociocultural, technological, environmental and legal – exert on a business to later chart its long term targets.

Being part of the external analysis when carrying out a strategic assessment or performing a market study, PESTEL gives an overview of diverse macro-environmental factors that any company should thoughtfully consider. By perceiving these outside environments, businesses can maximally benefit from the opportunities while minimizing the threats to the organization.



Key Factors Examined by PESTEL Analysis:

Political – What opportunities and pressures are brought by political bodies and what is the degree of public regulations' impact on the business?

Economic – What economic policies, trends and structures are expected to affect the organization, what is this influence's degree?

Sociological – What cultural and societal aspects will work upon the demand for the business's products and operations?

Technological – What impact do the technological aspects, innovations, incentives and barriers have on the organization?

Environmental – What environmental and ecological facets, both locally and farther afield, are likely to predetermine the business?

Legal – What laws and legislation will exert influence on the style the business is carried out?

IFE, EFE, IE Matrices

The Internal Factor Evaluation matrix (IFE matrix) is a strategic management tool helping audit or evaluate major weaknesses and strengths in a business's functional areas. In addition, IFE matrix serves as a basis for identifying and assessing relationships amongst those areas. The IFE matrix is utilised in strategy formulation.

The External Factor Evaluation matrix (EFE matrix) is a tool of strategic management that is typically utilised to assess current market conditions. It is an ideal instrument for visualising and prioritising the threats and opportunities a firm is facing.

The essential difference between the above mentioned matrices lies in the type of factors incorporated in the model; whilst the latter is engaged in internal factors, the former deals exceptionally with external factors – those exposed to social, political, economic, legal, etc. external forces.

Being a continuation of the EFE matrix and IFE matrix models, the Internal External matrix (IE matrix) rests upon an investigation of external and internal business factors



integrated into one suggestive model.

Porter Five Forces Analysis

The Porter's five forces analysis studies the industry of operation and helps the company find new sources of competitive advantage. The analysis surveys an industry through five major questions:

What composes a threat of substitute products and services?

Is there a threat of new competitors entering the market?

What is the intensity of competitive rivalry?

How big is the bargaining power of buyers?

How significant is the bargaining power of suppliers?
