Osage Bancshares, Inc. operates as a holding company for the Osage Federal Bank, which provides retail banking services.

Market Area

The bank's main office is located in Pawhuska, Oklahoma, as well as it serves Osage County and the northern portion of Pawnee County. Its branch offices are located in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, which services Bartlesville and surrounding Washington County, as well as the western portion of Nowata County, and also in Barnsdall, Oklahoma, which services Barnsdall and the surrounding rural area in Osage County.

Lending Activities

As of June 30, 2009, the bank's loan portfolio included real estate mortgage loans, including one- to four-family loans and non-residential loans; construction loans; automobile loans; second mortgage loans; commercial loans; and other consumer loans.

One- to Four-Family Mortgage Loans: The bank's lending activity includes the



origination of one- to four-family mortgage loans, which are secured by property located in Osage and Washington Counties, Oklahoma. It also originates hybrid loans, which have initial 3- or 5-year fixed terms, then convert to an adjustable rate.

Non-Residential Mortgage Loans: The bank originates various non-residential mortgage loans, including loans on motels, churches, retail/service properties, apartment and condominium buildings, medical and dental buildings, and other income-producing properties, including mixed-use properties combining residential and commercial space. It also originates loans secured by land.

Construction Lending: The bank's residential construction lending includes loans to individuals for construction of a primary residence, as well as loans to builders and developers for multi-unit or multi-house projects. It also makes loans to builders for the construction of residences.

Automobile Loans: The bank offers loans on new and used automobiles. Its automobile lending involves direct loans to existing customers for the purchase of a car or truck.

Second Mortgage Loans: The bank makes second mortgage loans on properties for which it holds the first mortgage. Its second mortgage loans are primarily fixed-rate loans for terms of up to 20 years.

Commercial Loans: The bank's commercial loans include loans secured by equipment, accounts receivable, inventory, and other business purpose loans. Such loans are generally secured by either the underlying collateral and by the personal guarantees of the borrower.

Other Consumer Loans: Other consumer loans offered by the bank include loans secured by personal property, including savings account loans, manufactured home loans, and unsecured consumer loans.

SWOT Analysis

SWOT, which stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats, is an analytical framework that identifies the internal and external factors that are favorable and unfavorable for a company.

Enhanced SWOT Analysis

Enhanced SWOT is a 3×3 grid that arranges strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats into one scheme:

How to use the strengths to take advantage of the opportunities?

How to use the strengths to reduce likelihood and impact of the threats?

How to overcome the weaknesses that obstruct taking advantage of the opportunities?

How to overcome the weaknesses that can make the threats a reality?

Upon answering these questions a company can develop a project plan to improve its business performance.

PESTEL Analysis

PESTEL (also termed as PESTLE) is an ideal tool to strategically analyze what influence different outside factors – political, economic, sociocultural, technological, environmental and legal – exert on a business to later chart its long term targets.

Being part of the external analysis when carrying out a strategic assessment or performing a market study, PESTEL gives an overview of diverse macro-environmental factors that any company should thoughtfully consider. By perceiving these outside environments, businesses can maximally benefit from the opportunities while minimizing the threats to the organization.



Key Factors Examined by PESTEL Analysis:

Political – What opportunities and pressures are brought by political bodies and what is the degree of public regulations' impact on the business?

Economic – What economic policies, trends and structures are expected to affect the organization, what is this influence's degree?

Sociological – What cultural and societal aspects will work upon the demand for the business's products and operations?

Technological – What impact do the technological aspects, innovations, incentives and barriers have on the organization?

Environmental – What environmental and ecological facets, both locally and farther afield, are likely to predetermine the business?

Legal – What laws and legislation will exert influence on the style the business is carried out?

IFE, EFE, IE Matrices

The Internal Factor Evaluation matrix (IFE matrix) is a strategic management tool helping audit or evaluate major weaknesses and strengths in a business's functional areas. In addition, IFE matrix serves as a basis for identifying and assessing relationships amongst those areas. The IFE matrix is utilised in strategy formulation.

The External Factor Evaluation matrix (EFE matrix) is a tool of strategic management that is typically utilised to assess current market conditions. It is an ideal instrument for visualising and prioritising the threats and opportunities a firm is facing.

The essential difference between the above mentioned matrices lies in the type of factors incorporated in the model; whilst the latter is engaged in internal factors, the former deals exceptionally with external factors – those exposed to social, political, economic, legal, etc. external forces.

Being a continuation of the EFE matrix and IFE matrix models, the Internal External matrix (IE matrix) rests upon an investigation of external and internal business factors



integrated into one suggestive model.

Porter Five Forces Analysis

The Porter's five forces analysis studies the industry of operation and helps the company find new sources of competitive advantage. The analysis surveys an industry through five major questions:

What composes a threat of substitute products and services?

Is there a threat of new competitors entering the market?

What is the intensity of competitive rivalry?

How big is the bargaining power of buyers?

How significant is the bargaining power of suppliers?
