P.T. Berlian Laju Tanker Tbk provides marine transportation services. The company provides local and overseas shipping services, including tanker, barges and tugboat operations.

The company provides cargo shipping with concentration on liquid cargo transportation services in Indonesia, Asia, Europe, and America. As of December 31, 2008, the company owned approximately 88 vessels with a total capacity of approximately 2 million dwt, including 61 chemical tankers, 14 oil tankers, 12 gas tankers, and 1 floating production, storage, and offloading vessel.

Operations

The company's main business is the maritime transportation of liquid bulk cargo. The types of cargo carried by its fleet include: crude oil and petroleum products; lubricating oil (base oil and additives); liquid chemical (organic and non-organic); liquified gas (LPG, propylene, propane, and other pressurized gas); and vegetable oil and animal fats. The company offers a range of maritime transportation and related services, including:



Time Charter: The company charters out its vessels to third parties on a range of terms, including short-term time charter; medium-term time charter; and long-term time charter basis.

Vessel Operation: The company charters out cargo space in its vessels to the third parties. The vessels used to provide these services include vessels owned by the company and chartered-in vessels.

Vessel Agency Service: The company acts as the general agent for various foreign vessels. Foreign shipping companies whose vessels enter into Indonesian waters contract a range of agency services from the company, including the arrangement of permits, the arrangement of port facilities, and the provision of supplies, such as fuels, freshwater, spare-parts, repair services, and others.

Shore Storage Rental: The company owns and operates shore storage facilities which it rents to the owners of liquid cargo.

Customers

The company has long-term relationships with the majority of its customers, who include the major international oil and chemical companies, such as Pertamina, Celanese Corporation, Exxon Mobil Corporation, Shell, BASF, SABIC, IPCC, and Dow Chemical.

History

The company was founded in 1981. It was formerly known as PT Bhaita Laju Tanker and changed its name to P.T. Berlian Laju Tanker Tbk in 1988.

SWOT Analysis

SWOT, which stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats, is an analytical framework that identifies the internal and external factors that are favorable and unfavorable for a company.

Enhanced SWOT Analysis

Enhanced SWOT is a 3×3 grid that arranges strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats into one scheme:

How to use the strengths to take advantage of the opportunities?

How to use the strengths to reduce likelihood and impact of the threats?

How to overcome the weaknesses that obstruct taking advantage of the opportunities?

How to overcome the weaknesses that can make the threats a reality?

Upon answering these questions a company can develop a project plan to improve its business performance.

PESTEL Analysis

PESTEL (also termed as PESTLE) is an ideal tool to strategically analyze what influence different outside factors – political, economic, sociocultural, technological, environmental and legal – exert on a business to later chart its long term targets.

Being part of the external analysis when carrying out a strategic assessment or performing a market study, PESTEL gives an overview of diverse macro-environmental factors that any company should thoughtfully consider. By perceiving these outside environments, businesses can maximally benefit from the opportunities while minimizing the threats to the organization.



Key Factors Examined by PESTEL Analysis:

Political – What opportunities and pressures are brought by political bodies and what is the degree of public regulations' impact on the business?

Economic – What economic policies, trends and structures are expected to affect the organization, what is this influence's degree?

Sociological – What cultural and societal aspects will work upon the demand for the business's products and operations?

Technological – What impact do the technological aspects, innovations, incentives and barriers have on the organization?

Environmental – What environmental and ecological facets, both locally and farther afield, are likely to predetermine the business?

Legal – What laws and legislation will exert influence on the style the business is carried out?

IFE, EFE, IE Matrices

The Internal Factor Evaluation matrix (IFE matrix) is a strategic management tool helping audit or evaluate major weaknesses and strengths in a business's functional areas. In addition, IFE matrix serves as a basis for identifying and assessing relationships amongst those areas. The IFE matrix is utilised in strategy formulation.

The External Factor Evaluation matrix (EFE matrix) is a tool of strategic management that is typically utilised to assess current market conditions. It is an ideal instrument for visualising and prioritising the threats and opportunities a firm is facing.

The essential difference between the above mentioned matrices lies in the type of factors incorporated in the model; whilst the latter is engaged in internal factors, the former deals exceptionally with external factors – those exposed to social, political, economic, legal, etc. external forces.

Being a continuation of the EFE matrix and IFE matrix models, the Internal External matrix (IE matrix) rests upon an investigation of external and internal business factors



integrated into one suggestive model.

Porter Five Forces Analysis

What composes a threat of substitute products and services?

Is there a threat of new competitors entering the market?

What is the intensity of competitive rivalry?
