

Epiomic Epidemiology Series: Addison's Disease Forecast in 10 Major Markets 2016-2026

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Abstracts

Addison's disease is a chronic and rare endocrinal disorder, caused by destruction of the adrenal cortex which leads to the reduced production of glucocorticoids, mineralocorticoids and adrenal androgens. Chronic adrenal insufficiency and hypersecretion of adrenocorticotrophic hormone (ACTH) is representative of the basic clinical signs and symptoms.

This report provides the current prevalent population for Addison's disease across 10 Major Markets (USA, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, UK, Brazil, Japan, India and Poland) split by gender and 5-year age cohort. Along with the current prevalence, the report also contains a disease overview of the risk factors, disease diagnosis and prognosis along with specific variations by geography and ethnicity.

Providing a value-added level of insight from the analysis team at Black Swan, several of the main symptoms and co-morbidities of Addison's disease have been quantified and presented alongside the overall prevalence figures.
