#### **Executive Summary**

Spinal cord stimulation (SCS) is a pain relief technique that delivers a low-voltage electrical current continuously to the spinal cord to block the sensation of pain. SCS is the most commonly used implantable neuro-stimulation technology for management of pain syndromes. The growth of the global Spinal cord Stimulation market is driven by a number of factors that include rise in ageing demographics, rising healthcare expenditure per capita, growing cases of obesity and increasing number of failed surgeries. Acknowledging these factors, it could be said that the Spinal cord Stimulation market business will certainly gain importance in the years to come.

Strict regulations, environment issues, dearth of expertise and trained healthcare workers and several other issues pose major challenge to the growth of this business.
