The decline in butter and margarine was a result of consumers moving away from margarine due to negative perceptions over the way it is processed. Instead, consumers have embraced natural fats such as butter. In particular, margarine and spreads witnessed a 14% decline in current value terms in 2017 led by margarine. Although margarine continued to decline, margarine blended with butter (less than 50%) is helping to prevent the overall decline in margarine and spreads being even worse. Industry...
