The chocolate segment of the liquor confectionery market is projected to reach USD 584 million by 2032. The widespread appeal of chocolate combined with alcoholic beverages drives this segment, which includes products like liquor-filled chocolates, truffles, and pralines known for their rich flavors and indulgent experience. The whiskey segment in the liquor confectionery market is expected to grow at a CAGR of around 5.3% through 2032. The popularity and versatility of whiskey-infused confections, such as chocolates, truffles, and candies, appeal to consumers seeking premium and sophisticated taste experiences. Whiskey's rich flavors and aromatic profiles enhance the indulgence factor of these confectionery products.

The market share from retail stores segment will grow at a notable rate over the forecast period. Retail stores serve as key points for consumer access and purchase, offering a wide range of liquor-infused confections, including premium and artisanal products that attract consumers seeking unique and indulgent treats. The strategic placement of these products in high-traffic areas within stores also contributes to

increased sales. Europe liquor confectionery market is expected to reach approximately USD 450.2 million, by 2032. European consumers show high demand for premium, artisanal products, including liquor-filled chocolates, candies, and gourmet treats.
