Summary

The G8 Government Spending industry profile provides top-line qualitative and quantitative summary information including: sector size (value 2019-23, and forecast to 2028). Key Highlights

The G8 countries contributed \$16,936.9 billion in 2023 to the global government spending industry, with a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 7.2% between 2019 and 2023. The G8 countries are expected to reach a value of \$21,521.8 billion in 2028, with a CAGR of 4.9% over the 2023-28 period.

Among the G8 nations, the US is the leading country in the government spending industry, with market revenues of \$9,332.0 billion in 2023. This was followed by Germany and the UK, with a value of \$2,060.6 and \$1,416.9 billion, respectively.

The US is expected to lead the government spending industry in the G8 nations with a value of \$11,797.3 billion in 2016, followed by Germany and the UK with expected values of \$2,430.0 and \$2,126.6 billion, respectively.
