The Middle East & African waste management industry recorded revenues of \$14 billion in 2023, representing a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 2.1% between 2018 and 2023.

Industry production volume increased with a CAGR of 1.6% between 2018 and 2023, to reach a total of 156.3 million tonnes in 2023.

Egypt accounted for the largest share of 21.8% of the Middle East & African waste management industry in 2023, followed by Saudi Arabia at 20.0%, South Africa at 15.1%, Israel at 12.2%, and the United Arab Emirates at 10.4%.
