Health tech adoption supports tele-locums in radiology and psychiatry, though reimbursement is uneven. influence cross-border placements.

Middle East & Africa

GCC investment in tertiary hospitals and centers of excellence drives specialty locums (anesthesia, ICU, cardiology, oncology). Currency volatility and credential recognition influence cross-border contracting. Tele-locums adoption rises where regulation allows, supporting night coverage and remote diagnostics. Vendors that navigate local licensing, tax, and data requirements, while offering transparent rate governance, gain traction with regional hospital groups.
